## November 22, 2025 - Cyclone Fina

On 22 November, the Reserve was significantly impacted by Cyclone Fina, resulting in the loss of one of the Reserve's largest mahogany trees. Due to its size and extensive root system, the fallen tree destroyed the skate park shade structure and caused damage to underground services. As a result, the Reserve was closed for approximately two weeks while assessments and repairs were undertaken to ensure public safety. The Reserve was reopened just in time for the Christmas Markets.
